Father Anthony Brown Named Superintendent

The Rev. Anthony Brown, Dean of Studies at Carroll College, has been named by the Most Rev. Joseph M. Gilmore, Bishop of Helena, as Superintendent of Education for the Helena Diocese. Father Brown succeeds the Rev. Paul Mackin, now pastor of Holy Rosary Parish, Bozeman, who held the position since 1952.

Father Brown entered Montana University in 1955 and in 1958 became the first person to be awarded a Doctor of Education degree there.

A native of Anaconda, Father Brown attended St. Paul's grade school, St. Peter's (now Anaconda Central) high school. He received his bachelor of arts degree from Notre Dame University in 1943. He did grad-

uate study in the classics at Catholic University and taught in high schools in Evansville, Ind., and Milwaukee, Wis., before entering St. Edward's Seminary in Kenmore, Wash., in 1945. He was ordained in April, 1949.

He served at St. Mary's and Holy Savior Parishes, Butte, and St. Peter's Parish, Anaconda. He was also principal of Anaconda Central from 1950 through 1952.

He received his master of science degree in education from St. Bonaventure's University, N.Y., in June, 1953. In September of the same year he was appointed to the faculty of Carroll College, and taught on the summer staff of St. Bonaventure's in 1955.
